One year after the tragic events of September 11, 2001, a short note appeared in a U.S. newspaper. It was simple. Quite. Powerful. Read it carefully. And if you're someone who often gets frustrated by little things in life—maybe read it twice.

"You may have heard about the CEO of a major company who survived the attacks simply because it was his turn to take his child to preschool. Another man lived because it was his day to bring donuts. One woman was late because her alarm clock didn't go off. Someone got stuck in traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike. Another missed the bus. One spilled coffee on her blouse and had to change. One persons car wouldn't start. Someone returned to answer a phone call. Another one's child took too long getting ready. One simply couldn't catch a cab. But what struck me most — was a man who survived because that morning, he wore new shoes. They gave him a blister, so he stopped at a pharmacy to buy a bandage. That's why he lived."

And now, when I find myself stuck in traffic, missing an elevator, going back home for keys, or answering a phone call at the last second... I pause and think:

Maybe I'm exactly where I'm meant to be. Maybe this delay is protection I'll never understand. So next time your morning doesn't go as planned --

The kids are slow to get ready. You can't find your keys. You hit every red light...

Don't get angry. Don't panic.

God might be at work. Protecting you in ways you'll never see.

YOUR BREAKTHROUGH IS COMING

It's easy to lift our hands when the bills are paid, the kids are healthy, and every door we knock on swings wide open.

It's easy to shout "God is good!" when life feels like sunshine and blessings are raining down.

But the true test of our worship is not found in the light... it's in the midnight!

Paul and Silas knew that kind of midnight. Their bodies were bruised, their feet in stocks, the cold walls of the prison pressing in. But at the darkest hour, when most people would have curled up in defeat, they prayed and sang praises to God.

And the prison couldn't hold them – because midnight worship shakes foundations!

Anyone can worship when life is easy... but the enemy trembles when you worship in the storm, when you sing in the valley, when you declare God's goodness while the tears are still falling.

That's worship the devil can't handle – because it says, "My God is worthy no matter what my eyes see right now!"

If you're in your own midnight season, don't let it silence your praise.

Worship anyway. Praise Him through the pain. Lift your voice in the dark.

Keep worshiping.
